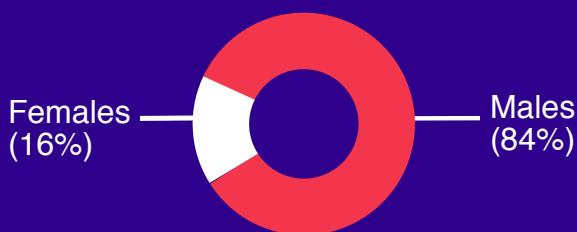

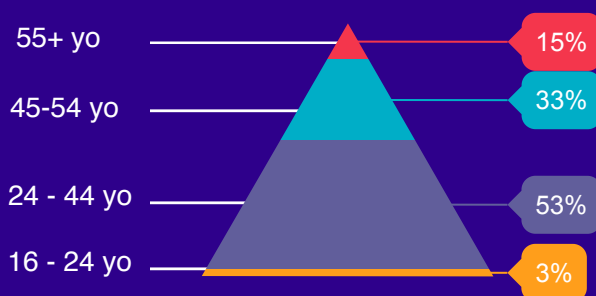

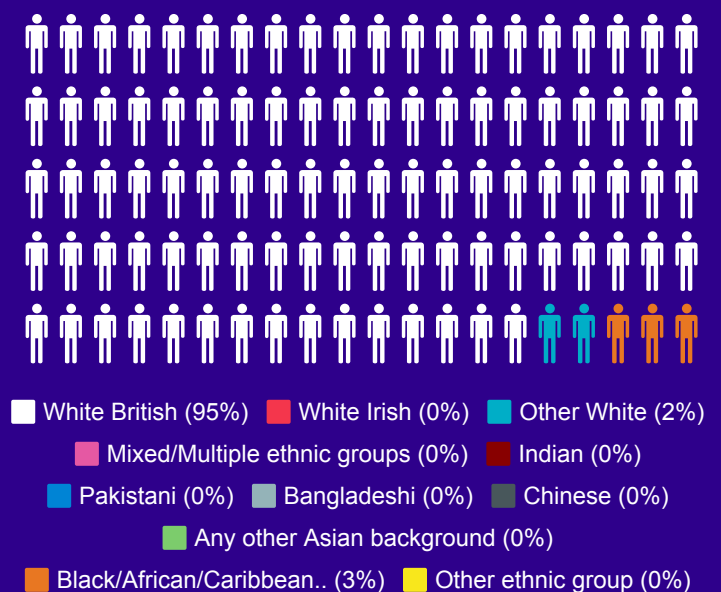

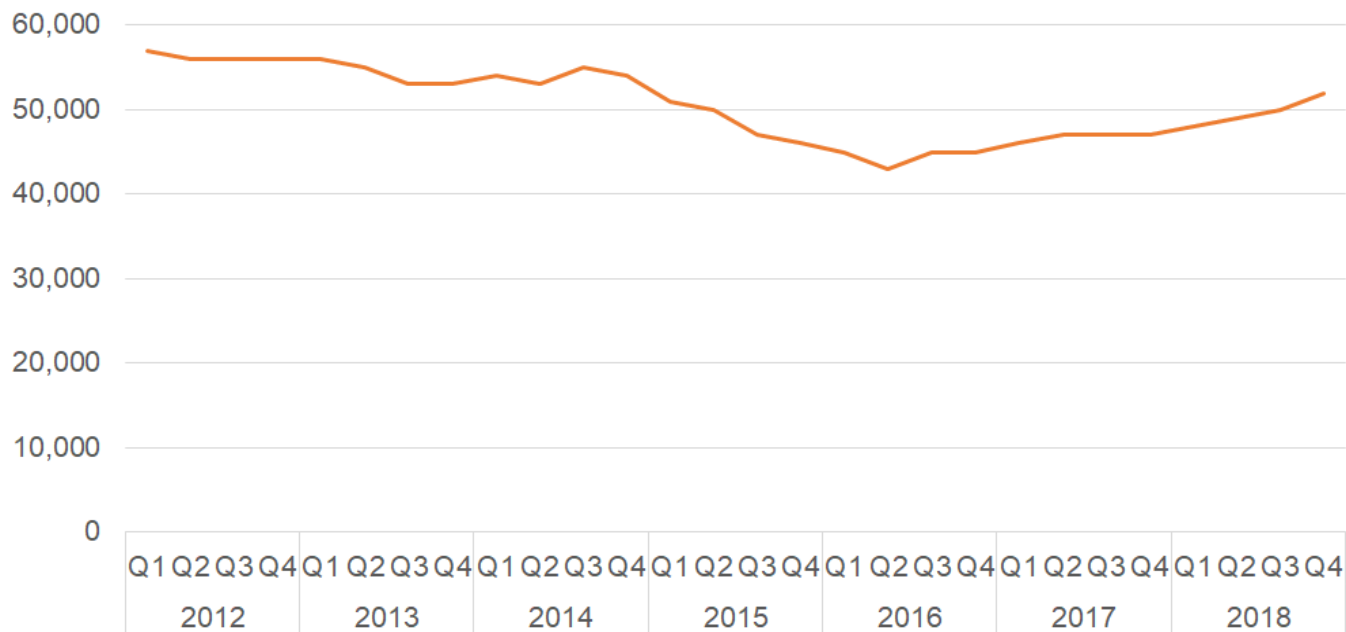

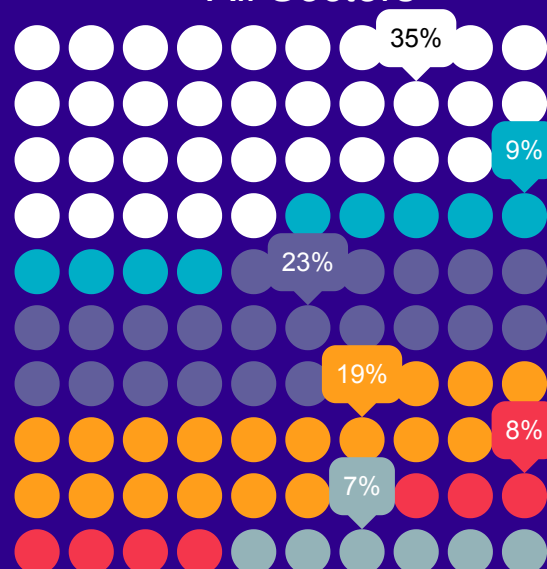

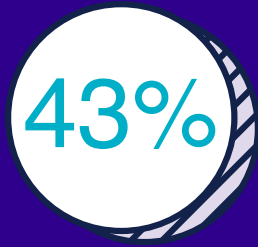

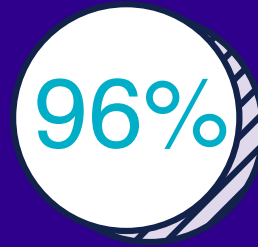

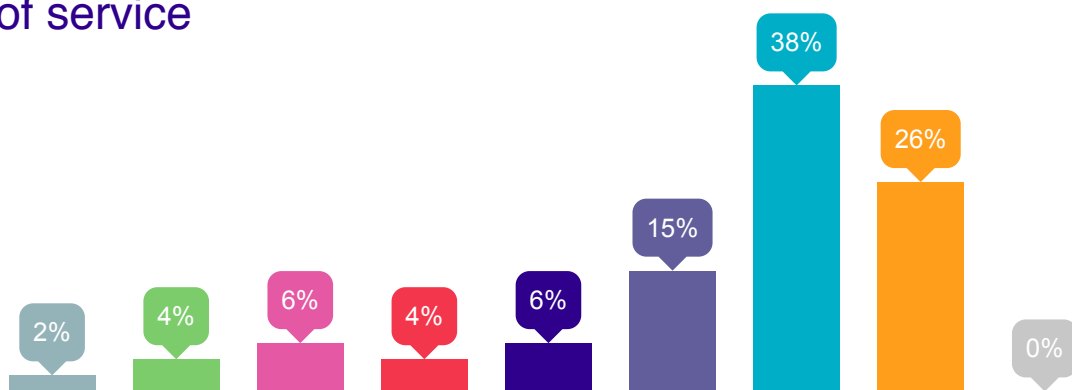


of employees in fire & rescue have worked **overtime (paid or unpaid)**, compared with 33% of all employees
